MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 15th October 2012

3. Minutes of Last Meeting:

This resolution was then passed by the Parish Council.

- c) Bench It was agreed that the clerk would order the bench from Neighbourhood Equipment at a discounted cost of £ 200.
- d) Notice Board Cllr Gilpin advised that the council that a notice board had been ordered at a cost of £90.
- e) Dial-A-Ride It was resolved to donate £50 towards the Dial a Ride Charity.

f)Poppy Appeal - It was resolved to give an increased donation of £100 to the Poppy Appeal this year, to include £20 for the wreath to be laid at Remembrance Day.

7. Sports Centre/Recreation Ground

a) Kitchen – The football club have proposed to provide the labour required to install the new kitchen units and in return the Parish Council would write off their debt for the hire of the recreation ground and Sports Centre, or part of the debt. A parishioner had asked one of the councillors if they could have the old units.

It was also noted that the sealed units of a number of windows in the Sports Centre are misting up and therefore will need replacing at a future date

- b) Playground Inspection The latest inspection had highlighted again the deteriorating state of the wet pour in certain areas of the playground. The clerk was asked to contact Safe and Sound to check if quote from Safe and Sound still stands if so it was agreed that the clerk should discuss the quote with ClIr Ash. The Parish Council agreed that the work to the wet pour and the replacement of the cradle swings could be authorised up to an £1000.
- c) Handyman The Parish Council had received a quote from Brian Small to carry out casual jobs . It was felt that the quote was too expensive for the type of work involved.
- 8. **Meeting Dates –** The Parish Clerk presented a list of the proposed meeting dates for Parish Council meetings for 2013 and these were agreed.

9. Outside Organisations

Cllr Cotton had attended the Community Impact meeting entitled 'Opportunities to develop Playing Fields and Open Spaces in Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes on 26th September. This included a workshop by Mark Healy a

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Projects officer for Fields In Trust. The Parish Council agreed that Cllr Cotton invites Mark Healy to come out and discuss the application /nomination process for the QE11 Playing Fields Challenge with the full council. The GALAF meeting on the 8th October had not been well attended, although County Cllr Puddefoot had attended the meeting. It looks as if the Vale of Aylesbury plan will be accepted as it stands and the AVDC Cabinet will discuss the New Homes Bonus at the October meeting.

The update from Inspector Glister on Operation Sideline was welcomed. This operation was a crackdown on the supply and use of drugs in Aylesbury and followed a fifteen month investigation into organised crime and drug supply including a London gang.

Cllr Robson reported on the North Bucks Parishes Planning Consortium on 10th October. The Vale of Aylesbury Plan was going to the full council on 17th. A consultation document was to be issued in January with every expectation that the draft document will be agreed in April or May. There is to be a meeting on the 26th October regarding affordable housing to consider the policy that 35% of any development should be affordable housing. It is believed the percentage for the Aylesbury East development may be 17% or as low as 15%.Cllr Gilpin volunteered to attend the meeting on the 26th and the clerk will respond to the e-mail to this effect. Other topics covered included the incineration plant at Calvert, as the opposition are seeking a judicial review, talk

of fracking at Twyford, Luton Airport plans, Oxford to Bedford rail expansion and the fact that the MP David Lidington had now commented that Aylesbury could do with a by-pass.

The District Councillor is to investigate the extra 49 houses in addition to the Aylesbury East Development that have been allocated to Bierton Parish in the Vale of Aylesbury Plan. There is to be a meeting with Arla and the County Council to consider the alterations to the Tring Road. The general

consensus of the Parish Council was that the drawings that had been submitted to date were not detailed enough and the effect of these alterations on the traffic through Aylesbury had not been thought through adequately. Clir Puddefoot will feed back to the Parish Council if larger and more detailed plans are produced.

It was also pointed out that if the Aylesbury East development goes ahead then this would have an impact on the road system including any right turn ban. The Parish Council wondered if the County Council or Arla were developing any contingency plans in case of problems on the roads i.e. if the A41 was blocked or road-works on any of the roads.

In view of the increasing likelihood that the Aylesbury East development would go ahead representatives of the Parish Council met with Engage planning and Peter Murphy the Project Director for Barratt Developments South East Region, based at Watford.

He advised that the development had not yet got the approval of Barratt's but although unlikely to yield large profits

the development would provide work on a long term basis. In terms of timescale, at the moment two S106 agreements had been drafted with over 20 million to AVDC and over 60 million to Bucks C.C. and it was thought that these would be agreed before Christmas. There would then be a 3 month period to allow anyone to go to a judicial review and it would be envisaged that the first physical work on the site would be in May 2013. Phase 1 would be the roads and the Stocklake link as part of the Eastern link would be completed within 5 years of starting the project.

It was proposed that a series of consultation groups would be set up that would be theme based and the attendance and participation of local residents in these groups would be welcomed. A record of this meeting would be sent to the Parish Clerk.

A discussion of the problems still to be solved then ensued. The main topic covered the fact that the proposal to have a ring road via estate quality roads did not seem viable. The Stocklake 'rural' link is being planned as a single road although apparently the developers will be obliged to leave room for a second carriageway. Other problems discussed included the design of the road junction with the A418, the road calming plans for the A418 and the link to the present Broughton Lane although it is proposed that lights will be installed on the bridge. It would seem that the decision to build a secondary school has not yet been taken and there was also a suggestion to look at extending Bierton School to cover the extra school provision needed before a primary school was built. Also the percentage of affordable housing is still a matter of discussion but would be less than the 35% Vale of Aylesbury target figure in order to reduce the costs to Barratt's. The RSPB have agreed to take over the nature reserve. It is proposed that there will be an information centre and a shop to provide an income stream to be used by the RSPB to manage the site

It is proposed that a meeting should be set up between the Parish Council and the highways department to discuss the transport concerns. Cllr Puddefoot is to find out the name of the person to contact.
